

RESOLUTION 14-08

A RESOLUTION TO PROVIDE FOR A REFERENDUM ELECTION ON AUGUST 26, 2014 TO DETERMINE WHETHER THE ELECTORATE SUPPORTS THE CONSTRUCTION OF A NEW COMMUNITY CENTER AT MACKLE PARK.

WHEREAS, Article VIII of the State Constitution and Chapter 166 of the Florida Statutes, provide that municipalities shall have the governmental, corporate, and proprietary powers to enable them to conduct municipal government, perform municipal functions, and render municipal services, and exercise any power for municipal purposes, except when expressly prohibited by law; and

WHEREAS, Section 101.161, Florida Statutes, provides the form and content for referenda ballots; and

WHEREAS, on April 21, 2014, the Marco Island City Council decided that there shall be a referendum held on August 26, 2014, to determine whether the electorate supports the construction of a Community Center at Mackle Park.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Marco Island, Florida:

Section 1. Vote of Electors at the August 26, 2014 Primary Election.

Included in the primary election of August 26, 2014 shall be a ballot question to determine whether the electorate of the City of Marco Island supports the construction of a new Community Center at Mackle Park.

Section 2. Language on the Ballot.

The ballot to be used in said referendum election shall be in the following form:

**REFERENDUM TO DETERMINE WHETHER TO CONSTRUCT A
NEW COMMUNITY CENTER AT MACKLE PARK**

Shall the City expend up to \$3.5 million dollars to construct a new Community Center up to 16,000 square feet at Mackle Park?

A "yes" vote will authorize City Council to proceed with the project.


A "no" vote will maintain the existing 6,500 square foot building.




