RESOLUTION NO. 10 – 18

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF MARCO ISLAND, FLORIDA DECLARING AN EMERGENCY FOR A CRITICALLY ERODED BEACH WITHIN THE BOUNDARIES OF THE HIDEAWAY BEACH DISTRICT WHICH REQUIRES EMERGENCY CONSTRUCTION OF A ROCK REVETMENT AND MAKING FINDINGS TO SUPPORT THE PUBLIC PURPOSE OF THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE ROCK REVETMENT IN THE CITY OF MARCO ISLAND, FLORIDA; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the area of the City of Marco’s northern beach located within the Hideaway Beach District between Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP) monument H– 12 to H–14 has suffered severe beach erosion, caused by this year’s winter storms and Tropical Storm Fay; and

WHEREAS, the District at its meeting of May 3, 2010 adopted Resolution 10-01 attached hereto as Exhibit A declaring an emergency for a critically eroded beach and ask the City Council to make the same findings; and

WHEREAS, the City of Marco Island, Florida finds that Hideaway Beach District has experienced severe beach erosion which requires emergency construction of a rock revetment to temporarily reduce erosion loss of the beach between FDEP monument H–12 and H–14; and

WHEREAS, approximately 134 condominium units located within the District at 5000 and 6000 Royal Marco Way abut the eroding beach between FDEP monuments H–12 to H–14 and are threatened by the continuing erosion; and

WHEREAS, the City and the District have retained Coastal Engineering Consultants, Inc. to seek FDEP permits for emergency construction of the rock revetment.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City of Marco Island, Florida, that:

SECTION 1. The area of the City’s and the District’s northern beach between FDEP H–12 to H–14 fronting Royal Marco Way Buildings 5000 and 6000 has experienced significant beach erosion as a result of this year’s winters storms and Tropical Storm Fay.

SECTION 2. The emergency construction of a rock revetment as proposed by Coastal Engineering Consultants, Inc. (CEC) is a viable temporary solution to the erosion; and CEC is hereby directed to make application to FDEP for an emergency permit approval to construct the rock revetment as described above.

SECTION 3. FDEP is requested to expedite permitting and approval for the rock revetment, as FDEP did for a rock revetment abutting the roadway Royal Marco Way where erosion threatened the sole access road to more than 300 homes on Royal Marco Way.

SECTION 4. The City Council of the City of Marco Island declares an emergency and directs and authorizes the City Manager or his designee to support and assist the District in

obtaining governmental approvals for the rock revetment and the City will assist the District with application on behalf of the District to the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) for reimbursement to the City and the District for the construction of the rock revetment and construction of a more permanent solution to the critical erosion.


SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE.

A RESOLUTION OF THE DISTRICT BOARD OF THE HIDEAWAY BEACH DISTRICT OF THE CITY OF MARCO ISLAND, FLORIDA DECLARING AN EMERGENCY FOR A CRITICALLY ERODED BEACH WITHIN THE BOUNDARIES OF THE DISTRICT WHICH REQUIRES EMERGENCY CONSTRUCTION OF A ROCK REVETMENT AND MAKING FINDINGS TO SUPPORT THE PUBLIC PURPOSE OF THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE ROCK REVETMENT IN THE CITY OF MARCO ISLAND, FLORIDA; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the area of the City of Marco’s northern beach located within the Hideaway Beach District between Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP) monuments H–12 to H–14 has suffered severe beach erosion, caused by this year’s winter storms and Tropical Storm Fay; and

WHEREAS, the Hideaway Beach District Board (District) finds that this severe beach erosion requires emergency construction of a rock revetment to temporarily reduce erosion loss of the beach between FDEP monuments H–12 and H–14; and

WHEREAS, approximately 134 condominium units located with the District at 5000 and 6000 Royal Marco Way abut the eroding beach between FDEP monuments H–12 to H–14 and are threatened by the continuing erosion; and

WHEREAS, the District has retained Coastal Engineering Consultants, Inc. (CEC) to seek FDEP permits for emergency construction of the rock revetment.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the District Board of the Hideaway Beach District of the City of Marco Island, Florida, that:

SECTION 1. The area of the City’s and the District’s northern beach between FDEP H-12 to H-14 fronting Royal Marco Way Buildings 5000 and 6000 has experienced significant beach erosion as a result of this year’s winters storms and Tropical Storm Fay.

SECTION 2. The emergency construction of a rock revetment is a viable temporary solution to the erosion; and CEC is hereby directed to make application to FDEP for a permit approval to construct the rock revetment as described above.

SECTION 3. FDEP is requested to expedite permitting and approval for the rock revetment, as FDEP did for a rock revetment abutting the roadway Royal Marco Way where erosion threatened the sole access road to more than 300 homes on Royal Marco Way.


SECTION 4. The City Council of the City of Marco Island is requested to declare and emergency and to direct and authorize the City Manager or his designee to support and assist the District in obtaining governmental approvals for the rock revetment and to make application to the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) for reimbursement to the City and the District for the construction of the rock revetment and construction of a more permanent solution to the critical erosion.

SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE.

This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon adoption.
