ORDINANCE NO. 99-6

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE BUDGET FOR THE CITY OF MARCO ISLAND FOR THE FISCAL YEAR COMMENCING OCTOBER 1, 1998, AND ENDING SEPTEMBER 30, 1999.

WHEREAS, the City of Marco Island adopted Ordinance No. 98-15, the City Budget, on September 21, 1998; and

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to amend the 1998-99 budget by transferring funds from the Public Safety Reserve Fund to the Public Safety Department;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MARCO ISLAND, FLORIDA THAT:

Section 1. Ordinance No. 98-15, the budget for the fiscal year commencing October 1, 1998, and ending September 30, 1999, be amended as provided in the attached Exhibit "A" and incorporated herein.


Section 2. Said transfer of funds from the Public Safety Reserve Fund to the Public Safety Department is for the purpose of implementing indigenous law enforcement utilizing the public safety concept to the maximum extent feasible.

Section 3. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon approval by the Marco Island City Council at second reading.


